



BIRD CONSERVATION PROGRAM (CUBS & BULBUL ACTIVITY)

How can we bring disappearing sparrows back to our cities? Tiny tots of SG observed what's ailing these small birds and how to survive their lives. Under the Paryavaran Mitra project of Center for Environmental Education (CEE), our students came forward and provided shelter and food to the birds. Nests are the place where birds incubate and cradle their young ones. There is considerable variety in their location, size, materials and method of construction.

Fifteen species of birds seen in India have been declared critically endangered by the International Union for Conversation of Nature(IUCN). The endangered birds which are on the decline are as follows -


The Great Indian Bustard, Red Headed Vulture, Forest Owlet, Spoon Billed Sandpiper, Jordon's Courser, Bengal Florian, White Bellied Heron, and Sociable Lapwing.

According to the report of IUCN updated till December 2013, the major reasons for the decline in the population of these birds include loss, modification, fragmentation and degradation of habitat, environmental contaminants, poaching and land use changes, particularly conversion of large areas for crop cultivation. Also, changes in cropping pattern due to various reasons, including implementation of irrigation schemes, increased pesticide usage, livestock-grazing, high levels of disturbance and developmental activities like mining and hydel projects resulted in marginal fall in their population, said the report.

The best part of this activity was spending time with the students outside the class room. It was wonderful to observe the nature and to care for the birds.


























"MOBILE LIBRARY"

Mobile library was started on 15th September 1928 in United States of America (The American School Library) established by Harper & Brothers. National Book mobile day, which is sponsored by the American library Association is celebrated in April each year on Wednesday of National library week.

In Gujarat, the credit of starting services of public library and mobile library (1911) as a part of Public Library Services in the province of Vadodara goes to Maharaja Sayajirao Gaekwad (3rd). In 1947, Libraries were established in the districts of Rajkot, Bhavnagar, Jamnagar, Junagadh and Surendranagar. Under the 'Library Improvement Scheme' of Central Govt., library buildings at these places were built at the cost of Rs. 15 lakh. There are two Central libraries in the state, District Govt. libraries at all the 26 district head quarters. The state Govt. has started 4574 grant-in-aid libraries with the help of Local Self Government Institutes and voluntary organizations. The State Government has established separate 'Gram Granthalay' in more than 3500 villages. Whereas, after 1985, the services of mobile library have been started at Sabarkantha, Surat, Surendranagar, Vadodara, Gandhinagar, Bhavnagar and Bhuj district headquarters in the State.



'TWIST & TURN' - 2019

A unique competition of solving Rubik's Cube was organized under the title 'Twist & Turn - 2019 on 5th January to promote calculative and mathematical skills among the school children of SVKM. The students of S.G. English Medium of Grade V -VIII enthusiastically participated in the Inter school Twist & Turn competition conducted by Vedic Maths Department. The contest comprised of two rounds and the winners were honoured with medals, trophies, certificates and prizes. The total strength figured to a huge number of 5000+ students in Round - 1. In Final Round, 120 students were selected to solve the tricky Rubik's Cube. The participants solved the Rubik's cube with the lightening speed of hardly few seconds. The secret to their speed was their practice in the regular sessions attended by the students in school hours. Succinctly, it was an engaging and Exceptional approach of Management to enhance the mathematical skills among the youngsters.

'The expert in anything was once a beginner.'


Keeping the above quote in mind we organized Gyan Manthan on 02-02-2019 [Saturday] along with PTA meeting of FA-3 exam.

The objective of this event was to develop hidden skills of students and provide Knowledge about various important aspects of life




SPORTS DAY


