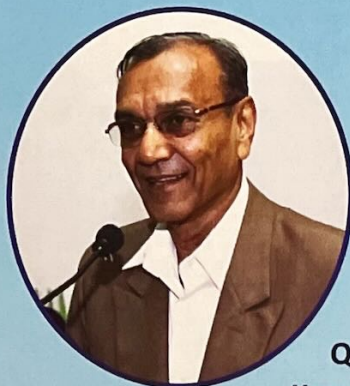

Promotion of organic farming and other farming practices that are chemical free are gaining popularity in the world today. This is because that has to be clean, healthy and sustainable for the prosperity of civilization. Therefore in the current academic session our school has started a project of organic farming. Under this project we have made several pits (only one operational at a time) in the corner of the school ground and collect kitchen waste from our campus hostel and the students were motivated to participate in the project. The materials required are water, vegetable peels, earthworms, dried leaves etc. At the same time we had kept clay pots in each class to collect the biodegradable wastage.

There are three major reasons why organic farming is of great benefit to the world today. The prime reason is the reduction of deaths to the living organism including the human beings by minimal use of chemically manufactured farm inputs like fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides. Secondly, the society will benefit from healthy food due to healthy farm products. Finally, it greatly reduces the greenhouse gas emissions that are dangerous to the ozone layer hence combating the changes in climatic conditions. Agriculture is the main source of greenhouse gases. Fertilizers like urea release a gas called nitrous oxide that is a dangerous greenhouse gas.

The organic farming is predicted to rise shortly due to the massive training in the agricultural institutions across the world. Students in most of the universities and middle-level colleges offering agricultural courses expose their students to familiarize themselves with the organic industry through Lab Management Programs, Capstone, and Self-Audit. The lab management program is a process of establishing an organic farm where students familiarize themselves with different organic agriculture practices. The acquired skills are then disseminated to the neighboring farming society. They offer training programs to local farmers in the society on the promotion and practice of organic farming. The organic farming is projected to rise due to the urge by farmers to satisfy the supply by embarking in organic farming.

Tiny tots exhibited their artistic and creative skills and taste through this paper folding in various and distinctive way and made different models with keen interest.



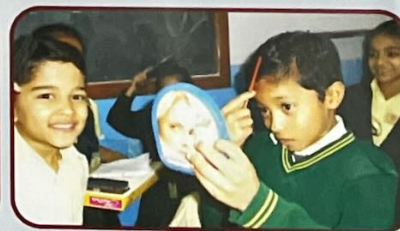
Mud-day :

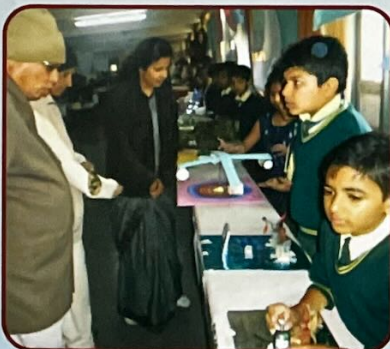
Demo on Household works :

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2 Guj teachers win all-India essay competition, rank sixth among 2,000

The essays will be compiled & published by global publishers Viva Education

Two essays written by teachers from Gujarat state have been selected for publication. Nili Singh and Jyoti Ardesana had taken part in a recent all-India online competi-

tion on the topic 'teachers on teaching'. These teachers ranked sixth in the contest. Singh is the principal of SG school, Kadi campus, while Ardesana is from Stree Rakshitani Harikrishna Academy. The essays will be compiled and published by Viva Education which is a 35-year old organisation that publishes and distributes books globally. More than 2,000 entries were received for participation of which the best 200 essays will be compiled in a book. The essay by

Nili Singh talked on value-based education and suggested that instead of narrating stories to the kids, there should be value-based exercises and games. This approach impacts kids strongly and helps nurture deep values. Singh emphasized the need to focus on first preparing human beings who can cater to the need of the society and nation in a humane way. She said, "I was never into writing. I read inspirational books by

Sudha Murthy and Shiv Khara. It helped me express my ideas clearly. I took part in the contest but never expected to make it." Jyoti Ardesana, Computer Science teacher of class IX and XII said, "I wrote an essay on how to convert teaching to learning. I also emphasised on adopting easy methodologies by students such as practical learning through pictures, graphic vision etc." She added, "It's a great feeling that my essay is se-

lected. It encourages me to think differently. Such platform helps to improve teaching at every level. It is a challenging time for teachers as well as students. In fact it is about time we adopted activity-based learning in a major way." Director of Viva Education, Jayakumar said, "We campaigned at schools for the competition. We offered great prizes to the winners such as cash prize of Rs5,000, mini laptops, tablets, pendants and certificates."
