



SCIENCE TALK


From the desk of science, myself and my fellow science teachers convey our regards to you. We hope you all liked the previous edition of **Ignite**. In this edition, We would like to highlight a burning health problem which is a great concern to our children at all age group. Yes, We are talking about **"WORM INFESTATION"**. Worms live as parasitic adult in child G.I. [Gastro Intestinal] track i.e. the area of stomach & small intestine.

Worms which infect human can be divided into 3 groups:

- 1. Round worms, Whip worms, Hook worms
- 2. Tape Worms, Flukes

Symptoms:

- 1. Itching around the anal area especially at night
- 2. Poor appetite which leads to weight loss
- 3. Stomach discomfort
- 4. Restless sleep and inability to concentrate



Most Important:


- 1. DEWORM YOUR CHILD—It is Periodic treatment with Anthelminthic [deworming] medicines.
- 2. WHO Recommendation WHO recommends periodic treatment with anthelminthic medic without previous individual diagnosis to all at risk people living in endemic area (people living highly risk area who are more prone to the disease).

Tablet & suspension of Albendazole is mostly preferred medication used for the treatment of variety of parasitic worm infestation.

Dosage : Less than 60 kg 15 mg/kg/day orally in divided doses twice a day with me

Max. Dose: 800 mg/day.

Duration: 28-day cycle followed by a 14-day drug-free interval, for a total of 3 cycles.
