On 24th June 2017 the school organised an orientation programme for the new student parents. The idea behind the programme was to acquaint the parents regarding the forthcoming activities in the year 2017-18. Parents were highly appraised not only towards academics but also by the endless efforts for the overall grooming of their children by uplifting them in sports and other extracurricular activities to explore their innate abilities.

We have eased the task of the parents by launching our own website which provides the parents on online access to the assignment/Question papers payment of fees and other activities.

Dear Parents,

Our institution has always been keen to ensure the safety and welfare of children. It has been our prime concern to provide a safe and secure environment to the children.

The following measures are taken by the school authorities as under:-

- The entire school campus is monitored and accessed by the CCTV Cameras at the entries, exits, corridors, washroom entrances etc.
- School buses are monitored through CCTV and GPRS facilities with the presence of a female attendant in each bus.
- Regular training sessions and demos are arranged for the staff members and students as precautionary measures at the time of disasters like fire, earthquake etc.
- Children are allowed entry in the school premises 30 minutes before the school timings i.e. 6:50 am.
- Guards are appointed at the entry and exit of the school gates, wash Room areas, water areas etc. One extra guard has been deputed building wise.
- Children are accompanied by the teachers right from the school gate to their respective classroom. They are under constant vigilance during the school hours including the recess time.
- A staff has been deployed for the constant surveillance of the CCTV cameras.
- All the teaching and non-teaching staff members have undergone Police verification and proper records of the same are maintained.
- Each class has been provided with washroom passes (4 for each class) and the students have to use them compulsorily.
- First Aid kit has been made compulsory for following: Field Trip/ Picnic / Tour / Play ground to overcome any mishaps.
- Parents/ Guardians are allowed in the school premises with a gate pass/ parent card.
- Discontinue Birthday celebrations (distribution of sweets).



Seeking Parents' Support for the Following Safety Measures:

- Kindly send your ward 20 minutes prior to the commencement of the school.
- Collect your wards on time within 15 minutes after the school is relieved.
- Parents are expected to bring their Parent's ID card compulsorily for taking their wards during school hours. We don't send the child with any other unknown person. Kindly avoid sending any other representatives.
- Students are expected to wear School ID Card daily including Birthdays without fail.
- Kindly ensure vehicle used by ward is not over crowded.

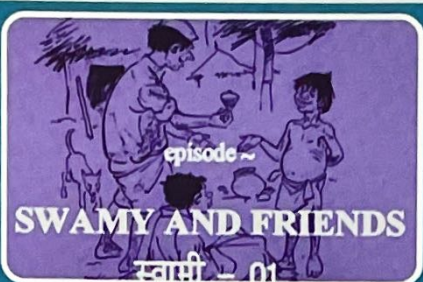

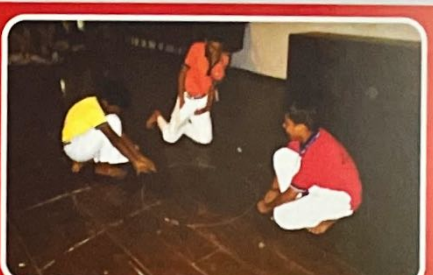

How to benefit from subsidy for solar energy in Gujarat

THE FUTURE OF SOLAR IN INDIA



From The desk of science my heartiest regards to all of you. Hope you liked our previous edition of science talk. In this edition we shall discuss regarding roof top solar system installation, for which Gujarat government gives exemption in price.

In a positive move to encourage ROOF TOP SOLAR INSTALLATION in Gujarat for residential consumers, Gujarat has announced the subsidy for solar installation on roof top across the state. The real beauty & advantages of solar lies in distributed market. (I.e. individual opting for roof top solar installations as energy is consumed at the same point where it is generated and no additional requirements of land coupling with the benefits of no transmission & distribution losses benefiting both generations & utilities.

Highlights of subsidy for roof top solar plant in Gujarat:

Subsidy of Rs. 10,000/KW will be disbursed by GEDA with a maximum limit of Rs. 20,000/customers i.e. up to 2KW solar roof top systems.

The state subsidy benefit is additional along with the subsidy/CFA from central government which is up to 30% of the bench mark cost for General category states.

Let's take an example:

Let's assume the cost of 1 KW of rooftops solar system is Rs. 70,000/-

Less CFA benefits up to 30% i.e. Rs. 20,000/-

Less Gujarat state solar subsidy i.e. Rs. 10,000/KW

This brings the total cost of roof top solar in Gujarat at just Rs. 40,000/KW.

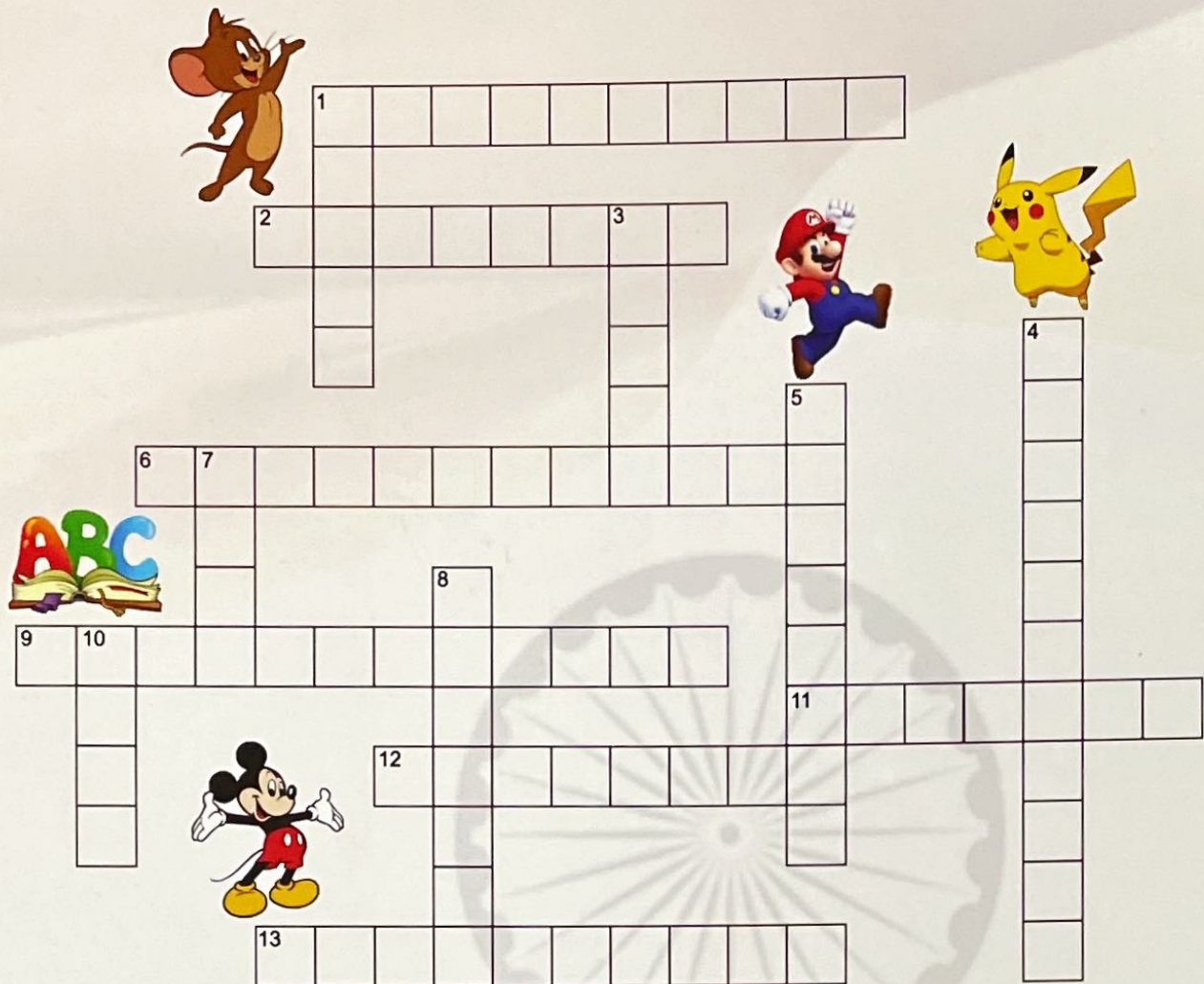
This makes the overall roof top solar scenario very lucrative & beneficial for residential consumers in Gujarat.

Hurry up!!! The first 1,00,000 consumers will get the benefit of the roof top solar subsidy.

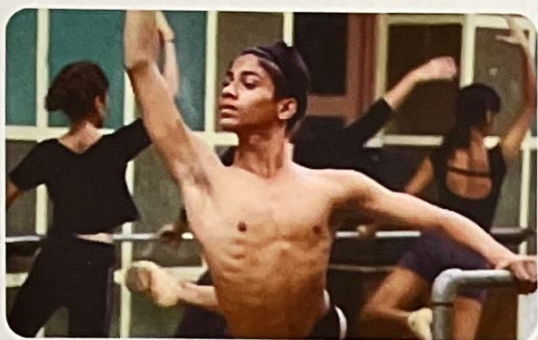

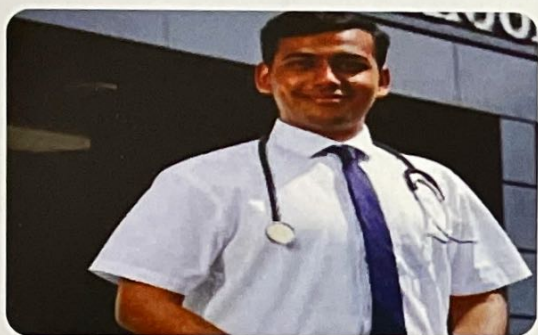

Mumbai welder's son gets call to NY ballet school: The idea of a welder's son pirouetting gracefully on one toe to classical strains from Italian Renaissance courts may sound far-fetched, but not to 15-year-old **Amiruddin Shah** — or Amir as he prefers to be called. Amir (in picture) is all set to put India on the global ballet map as one of India's first professional male dancers, who has recently earned a berth at the American Ballet Theatre's Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School in New York City for a one-year pre-professional course.

The 36-year-old Jhajharia, who is the first Indian to win two Paralympics gold medals, was the first choice of the Awards Selection Committee headed by Justice C.K. Thakkar. Former national hockey team skipper Sardar Singh was the other nominee for the prestigious award.



An Indian-origin doctor is set to become the UK's youngest physician to start work at a hospital in north-east England. Arpan Doshi graduated with his Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery degree from the University of Sheffield at the age of 21 years and 335 days and is due to start work as a junior doctor in New York. He will beat the previous record for the youngest doctor to start work in the country by 17 days.

Arpan originally went to a local school in Gandhinagar, Gujarat, until he was 13.

The University of Sheffield was so impressed with his credentials that they gave him a scholarship worth 13,000 pounds.

Our institute Sarva Vidyalaya Kelavani Mandal has adopted four government schools in 2015. i.e.

These schools have been adopted for grooming scholastic & co-scholastic areas. A team of observers headed by the coordinator is appointed to co-ordinate with the working of all the four government schools. Institutions conduct frequent meetings with the staff regarding the progress & development of the school & all associated institutions to do it.

➤ Steps taken for the progress of the school:

- 1. All the schools were renovated & approx. Rs. 25,00,000/- were spent till date.
- 2. Students are provided with health check-up facilities, exam kits (for STD: 10th & 12th), practice note-books, uniforms to the needy.
- 3. For the first time annual function was organized in the schools in order to bring out the hidden talent of the students.
- 4. Free educational visits & picnics.
- 5. Organizes sports day annually, Sports kit is provided without any charges.
- 6. Toppers are given Scholarships, free college education for 4 years & job security.
- 7. Extra classes are arranged after school with free lunch facility.
- 8. Free entry in Summer camp organized by SVKM Trust.



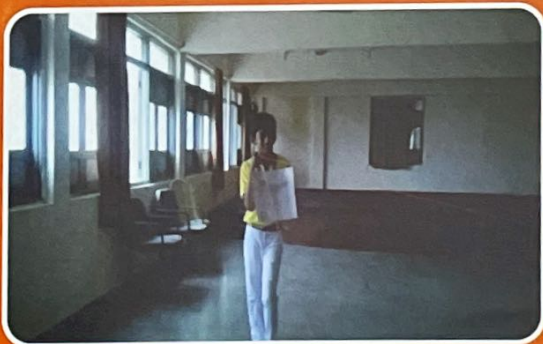
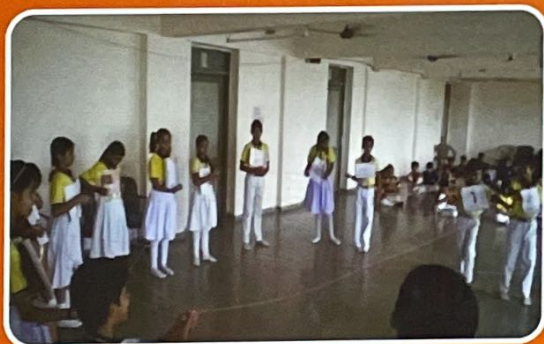
CEE

Under the Prayavaran Mitra project our school had conducted a project called valuing Biodiversity (Web of Life). This program was sponsored by Microsoft Create to Inspire School Programme and Center for Environmental Education(CEE). In an ecosystem, plants and animals all rely on each other to live. Scientists sometimes describe this dependence using a food chain or a food web. Through this activity, the students realized the importance of food chain and the creatures' extinction due to global warming. Gradually, we too are going on a path of extinction.

Students came to know about the following impacts:

- Food chain is the transfer of energy from one species to another.
- All living things need energy for living beings to grow.
- Within a food chain, some living things create the energy (producers) and some use the energy (consumers).
- Plants are producers of energy, as they make their own food (using sunlight, soil, and other elements).
- Animals are consumers, because they have to eat other animals and plants
