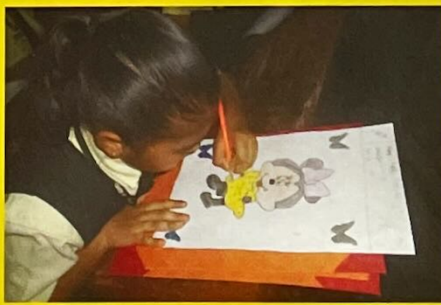

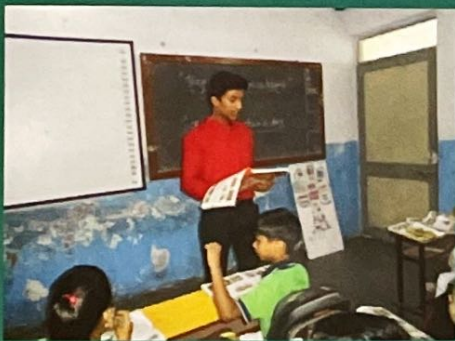

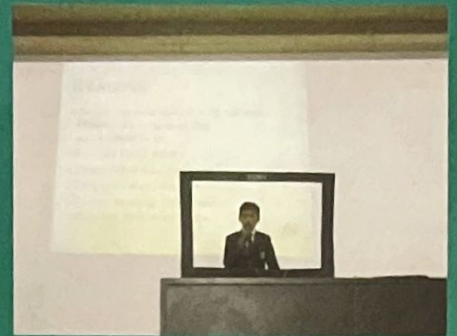

SAVE TIGER

Number of Tigers Increase in India, But Shortage Remains

Global Tiger Day also known as International Tiger Day, is an annual celebration to raise awareness for tiger conservation, held annually on July 29. It was created in 2010 at the Saint Petersburg Tiger Summit. The goal of the day is to promote a global system for protecting the natural habitats of tigers and raise public awareness and support for tiger conservation issues.

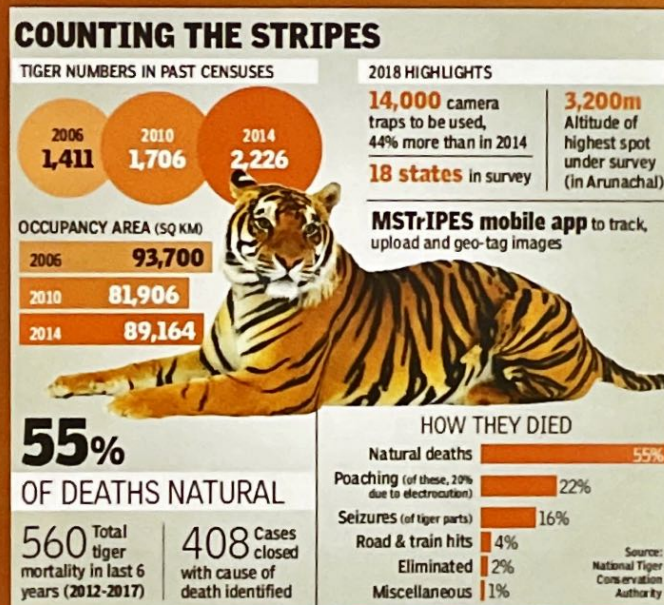
In India, the numbers of tigers are increasing constantly. In 2006, there were 1,411 tigers, which increased to 1,706 in 2010 and 2,226 in 2014. Around 97 per cent of the world tiger population perished in the last 100 years and according to the latest statistics, only 3,890 tigers are left in the world, out of which 2,226 are in India.

In 2010-11, the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) in partnership with the Wildlife Institute of India (WII) undertook an independent management effectiveness evaluation (MEE) of the 49 tiger reserves in the country. The reserves were categorized into four major categories. Karnataka has the highest number of tigers in the age group of 1.5 years with more than 408 big cats. Other states with significant populations included Uttarakhand (340), Madhya Pradesh (308), Tamil Nadu (229), Maharashtra (190), Assam (167), Kerala (136) and Uttar Pradesh (117).

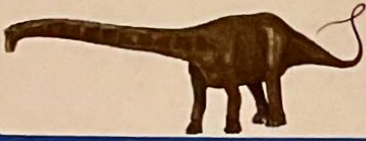
While the count is something to be proud of, experts believe issues such as poaching, receding forest areas and development projects infringing on tiger habitat need to be tackled. The global status of tiger continues to be a concern, threatened by the much-articulated causatives.

The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) has launched the M-STRIPES (Monitoring System For Tigers-Intensive Protection and Ecological Status), a mobile monitoring system for forest guards.

Earlier this year, Wild Life Institute of India kicked off tiger census 2018 with better technology and more cameras. Considering the trend of the last 10 years, it is expected that the report, likely to be released in 2019, will show a rise in numbers.

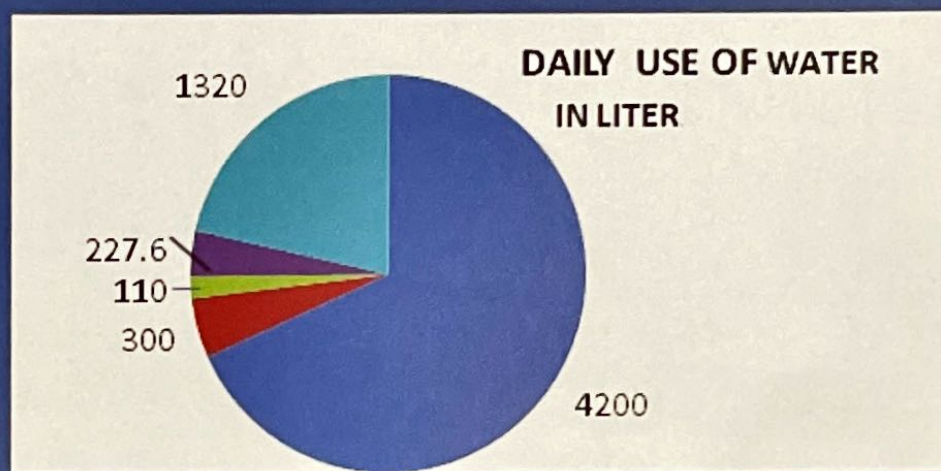
WATER MANAGEMENT at S. G.

As environmental problems grow gradually and their effects are left in various ways such as shortage of potable water. Among the various solutions offered to solve these problems is "Water Education through Water Management". Under the water management project in our school, water containers were placed near the entry and exit points of the school to collect extra / waste water from the students of the school to utilize it in the other activities such as watering the plants and cleaning. This programme is under the Paryavaran Mitra project of Center for environmental Education (CEE).

USE OF WATER IN SCHOOL:

Most of the water in our School is used in mopping floor, hand wash and toilets. Usage of drinking water is comparatively less. Two drums are placed in our school where students pour the water left in their bottle while going home. This water is used to water the plants. The waste water from drinking water taps can be reused for gardening.

The results showed that there is a change in the student's conception about water, attitude towards water usage, general opinions related to the water. They would understand and appreciate the interlinked dimensions of water.

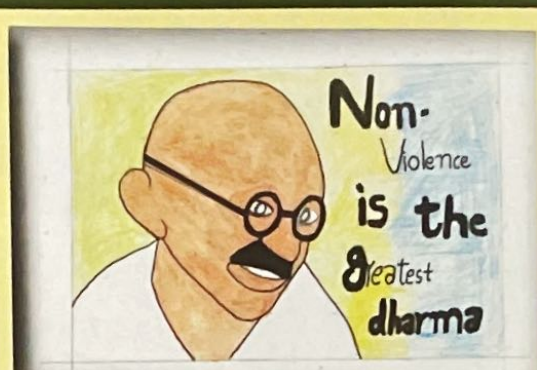
