Small Places, Big Dreams

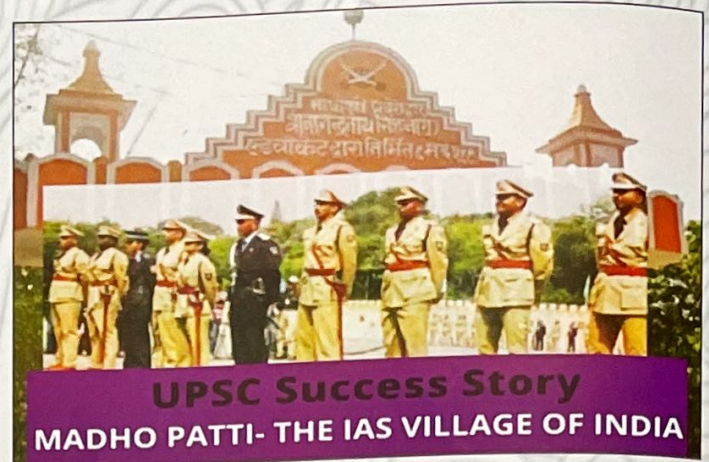
"Don't judge a book by its cover"

Famous Failures

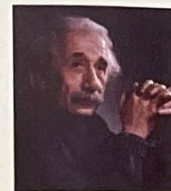

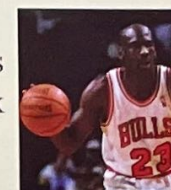
Lesson: Believe in your vision even when others don't. Perseverance can turn dreams into reality.

I am Piyu Majumder, Head Girl of S. V. English Medium School. I feel blessed to be associated and a part of S. V. Family.

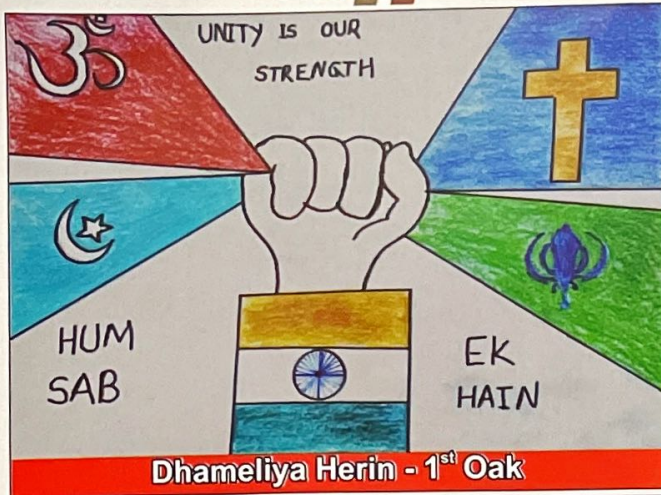
